

Help Protect the Right to Vote for People with Disabilities in South Carolina!



The Arc of South Carolina is working with the ACLU to learn more about how recent voting laws are affecting people with disabilities who need help voting absentee.

Are You or a Loved One Affected?

- ✓ You've needed help voting absentee in the past - or will in the future
- ✓ You've helped someone vote absentee in the past
- ✓ You want to help someone vote, but feel discouraged by the rules
- ✓ You've run into confusing or unfair barriers when trying to vote with support

What Changed in South Carolina Law?

- Only immediate family members or authorized voters can return an absentee ballot
- Helpers are limited to requesting or returning absentee ballots for no more than 5 voters per election
- Voting help is only allowed for people who are 'physically unable or incapacitated' - which may leave people out
